



## Coming to the End...

- We reflected on ourselves and how we can take courage from Paul's example




## The Last Chapters...

- Chapters 27 and 28 cover the journey of Paul as he is transported to Rome.
- There he will stand trial before Caesar.
- These chapters highlight both literal and spiritual lessons.
- As we read and reflect, let us allow our imagination and mind to paint a picture of Paul's ordeal.
- Here are key lessons from these chapters:




## 1. God's Sovereignty...

- Paul's journey was perilous, filled with storms, shipwrecks, and danger.
- Despite these trials, God had promised that Paul would reach Rome (Acts 23:11).
- This assures believers that God's purposes are not thwarted by external circumstances.
- Even in the midst of life's "storms,"
  God is in control




### 2. Obedience...

- When Paul warned the centurion and the ship's officers that the voyage would end in disaster, they ignored him.
- They trusted in their experience and the prevailing winds rather than heeding God's warning (Acts 27:9-12).
- This teaches the importance of listening to God's guidance, especially when it contradicts human wisdom.
- It also highlights the need for Christians to be prayerful and help nonbelievers to navigate situations.




# Leadership in Adversity....

- During the storm, Paul emerged as a leader.
- In Acts 27:21-25, when everyone had lost hope, Paul stood firm and reassured them, declaring that God had promised that they would be saved.
- His faith and courage gave others hope and were a source of inspiration.
- This shows how leaders can impact others, especially when they demonstrate unwavering faith in God.




#### Faith in God...

- God promised Paul that he would stand trial before Caesar and that all the people on the ship would survive (Acts 27:24).
- Paul's faith in this promise was steadfast, even when the situation appeared hopeless.
- This emphasizes the importance of trusting in God's promises, even when circumstances seem bleak.




## Importance of Prayer

- In Acts 27:29, Paul and the crew prayed during the storm.
- The chapter shows that prayer is vital in times of crisis.
- When everything else fails, prayer connects us with God's power and wisdom.
- Those who pray have strong faith because it shows where their confidence actually is.



## Relationships...

- When the ship was stranded, the soldiers wanted to kill the prisoners to prevent escape.
- Paul's life was spared because the centurion valued his life (Acts 27:42-43).
- God often uses others to protect His people, even when circumstances are dire.
- This teaches us that God can work through unexpected relationships to fulfill His purposes.






#### Protection...

- In Malta, Paul was bitten by a venomous snake, but he suffered no harm (Acts 28:3-6).
- This miracle demonstrated that God had a protective hand on Paul's life and work.

- The fire brought out the snake!



#### Presence...

- After the shipwreck, Paul was welcomed by the people of Malta,
- where he performed miraculous healings (Acts 28:8-9).
- This shows that God's presence and power are not limited to a particular place or situation.
- Even in unfamiliar places, God's work can continue through His servants.




## Hospitality...

- The people of Malta showed kindness and hospitality to Paul and the shipwrecked crew (Acts 28:2).
- This teaches the value of showing hospitality, kindness, and compassion, particularly in times of need.
- Paul's ministry was supported by those who offered help, demonstrating that God works through the generosity and kindness of others.
- Hospitality is a state of one's heart!



## Endurance...

- In Rome, Paul continued to preach the gospel even under house arrest (Acts 28:16, 23).
- He was not discouraged by his circumstances. T
- his is a reminder to persist in our calling, no matter how difficult the situation may be.
- Paul's patience and commitment to sharing the gospel serve as an example for all Christians



## The Message...

- In Rome, Paul boldly declared the message of the kingdom of God and taught about Jesus Christ (Acts 28:31).
- His unwavering commitment to preaching the gospel, even in the face of imprisonment,
- shows that the message of the kingdom is central to the mission of the church.
- The Men, The Mission, The Message!



# Reactions, Rejections, Revelations

- In Acts 28:23-28, Paul faces a mixed reaction from the Jewish leaders in Rome.
- Some believe, while others reject his message.
- This highlights a key truth about the gospel:
- it is divisive, and people's responses vary.
- Yet, as believers, we must remain faithful to proclaiming it, regardless of the outcome.



## The End...

- The book of Acts ends with Paul continuing to preach boldly and without hindrance (Acts 28:31).
- Despite facing rejection, imprisonment, and hardships, the message of Jesus continues to spread.
- This assures Christians that God's word will endure, no matter the opposition.
